The Istituto nazionale per la storia del movimento di liberazione in Italia was founded by Ferruccio Parri in 1949 with the aim of collecting and preserving the documentary heritage of Resistance. Subsequent archive and book acquisitions have widened its range of interests to the history of the whole 20th century. The Institute's structure includes a Historical Archive and a Library, both open to the public. In the Online Services section of the portal www.italia-liberazione.it it is possible to consult the data bank of the Archive and the Library. Furthermore, it is possible to get information about the activities and publications of the network of the Resistance Historical Institutes.

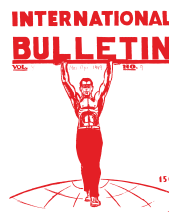

A tool for the history of the Communist Left

Teacher and journalist, Mauro Stefanini (1948-2005) was an important figure in the Partito comunista internazionalista-Battaglia comunista. The Archive is preserved at the Istituto nazionale per la storia del movimento di liberazione in Italia and contains documents of the Communist Left produced during the whole 20th century. Part of the material dates back to the Twenties and Thirties, when Italian leftist fractions had a significant influence at European level. There are records of the Partito comunista internazionalista, whose activity spans from the year of its birth – 1943 – till that of its split – 1952 –, and materials of Battaglia comunista and other political groups that followed in the footsteps of the Partito comunista internazionalista. Moreover, the Archive contains press of several political groups from all over the world, also not belonging to the Internationalist galaxy. Part of the Archive is Mauro's personal documentation, related to his political and professional activity. To be pointed out are the papers of Giacomo Stefanini and Maria Antonietta Falorni, both Internationalist militants and Mauro's parents.

In order to offer a wider view on archival sources related to the Internationalist movement, the meeting will provide a report on the private Archive of Bruno Fortichiari (1892-1981), who was a leading figure in the Communist Left.
